

I then enlisted in the *U.S. Army* and served as an *11B Infantryman*, where I earned the *Expert Infantryman's Badge*. I was also an *11H Heavy Anti-Tank TOW Gunner*, with the distinction of being the Battalion Top Gunner for four years in a row. At the end of my enlistment, I was selected as the *Brigade Commander's Personal Driver*, and then as a *Division Commander's Staff Driver*, where I was privileged to drive *5 Star General of the Army Omar Bradley*.

When I left the U.S. Army, I then enlisted in the Illinois National Guard 133rd
Signal Battalion as a 72E Tactical Telecommunication Center NCO.

After the Illinois National Guard, I enlisted into the *U.S. Air Force Reserves 13th Contingency Hospital*, 932nd *Aeromedical Wing* as an *Ophthalmology Specialist* until the end of the Gulf War.

My lovely wife of 42 years, Barbara, began her American Legion career as a Junior Auxiliary member and is currently serving as the Unit 30 President in Sparks, Nevada. She gained her initial eligibility through her father, Rowland Miller, who served in WWII in the Pacific Theater and her grandfather, Roland Miller, who served in WWI.

I have served in The American Legion and the Sons of The American Legion in several capacities and at all levels.  - Senators Cortez-Masto, & Rosen, along with Representatives Horsford, Lee, & Titus are co-sponsors.
- H.R. 2605 & S. 1441 The Service Dogs Assisting Veterans (SAVES).
 - Senators Cortez-Masto, & Rosen, along with Representative Lee are cosponsors.
- H.R. 3151 & S. 1536 SHIPS for America Act of 2025.
 - o Representative Amodei is a co-sponsor.
- H.R. 3838 National Defense Authorization Act of 2026.
 - o Section 1092 Chaplains Hill Memorial at Arlington National Cemetery.
 - The 2026 NDA has passed the house without amendment section 1092.
- H.R.5401 Pay Our Troops Act of 2026.
 - o Representatives Horsford, Lee, & Titus are co-sponsors.

With 70 out of 82 days out of session, Congress hasn't gotten much done and now come the Thanksgiving and Christmas breaks.

The government was funded and reopened after a record setting 43-day shutdown.

The Matthew Axelson Foundation under the umbrella of the non-profit Cupertino Veterans Memorial Corporation (www.cupertinoveteransmemorial.org) is in the middle of a campaign to raise funds to support veterans' organizations. Who is Matthew Axelson? Matthew "Axe" Axelson was a United States Navy SEAL who was killed in the War in Afghanistan. He was posthumously awarded the Navy Cross, the highest award the Navy can give, for his actions during Operation Red Wings, in which he was killed. His story and that of his teammates is told in the book and movie *Lone Survivor*. Operation Red Wings, June 27-28, 2005, was the most highly decorated small team action in naval history. Awards bestowed include: one Medal of Honor, 3 Navy Crosses, 16 Bronze Stars, 20 Purple Hearts.

This tournament is a wonderful way to interact with our military players (active duty & retired) and show them how much we appreciate their service. The money we raise each year goes to various military organizations.


