Hello Legionnaires

Continuing with our history. (This information comes from Legion.org)

1940's

September 1942:

The Preamble to the Constitution of The American Legion is changed for the first and only time since it was written in 1919. The word "War" is changed to "Wars."

December 1943:

Past National Commander Harry W. Colmery starts to write the first draft of what will later become the "GI Bill of Rights" - considered the Legion's single greatest legislative achievement.

June 1944:

President Franklin D. Roosevelt signs into law the original GI Bill, or Servicemen's Readjustment Act, ushering in monumental changes in U.S. society.

1950's

May 1950:

The Legion votes to contribute funds to the field of mental health, thereby playing a key role in launching the National Association for Mental Health.

July 1954:

The American Legion Child Welfare Foundation is formed.

<u>1960's</u>

September 1966:

The Legion voices great concern over the fate of prisoners of war in Vietnam. Today, the Legion uses a full accounting of all POWs and troops missing in action.

August 1969:

The Legion's National Executive Committee establishes the National Emergency Fund as a result of Hurricane Camille.

<u>1970's</u>

May 1972:

The Legion implements a Halloween safety program for children.

April 1975:

The Legion - sponsored Freedom Bell goes aboard the Freedom Train during its tour of the country in celebration of the U.S. Bicentennial. Six years later,, the bell is dedicated at its permanent home location in Columbus Plaza, opposite Union Station in Washington.

Cortez Masto Announces Naming Initiative for Elko Veterans Cemetery

Washington, D.C. –Today, U.S. Senator Catherine Cortez Masto (D-Nev.) announced that the National Cemetery Administration (NCA) is soliciting name recommendations from veterans and military organizations for the Elko veterans cemetery, which is set to begin construction this year. Senator Cortez Masto was<u>instrumental</u> in the approval of this rural national cemetery, which will for the first time provide burial benefits in the Elko region to approximately 3,700 Veterans and their eligible family members.

Name recommendations can be submitted to the NCA through December 17, 2021 and must help identify the location of the cemetery, have broad appeal to the veteran population, and be relevant to local history, geography, or other community features.

Before being approved earlier this year, Elko had been under consideration for a veterans cemetery since 2011, when the VA's *Rural Initiative* identified the area as in need of a National Veterans Burial Ground. The closest veterans cemeteries for regional veterans and their families are currently over 200 miles away – in either Fernley or Salt Lake City. Senator Cortez Masto's efforts have been instrumental in speeding up the process and securing a final commitment from the VA to begin construction on the Elko site. She's <u>called</u> on both the VA and the Bureau of Land Management (BLM) to support her efforts to create the Elko Veterans Cemetery, and she previously introduced legislation to <u>authorize</u> the creation of the burial ground.

Veterans Guest House History

The Veterans Guest House has a long history as the best kept secret in Reno. The "Home Away from Home" is the only facility of its kind in the country serving U.S. military veterans by providing accommodations for those veterans receiving medical/dental care in Reno. The veterans' families are also provided with accommodations, The House is privately funded and receives no funding from the government.

In the early 1990s, a couple of veterans, Chuck Fulkerson and Dick Rhyno, were visiting the Veterans Administration Medical Center of the Sierra (VAMC) early one morning and noticed that windows of the cars in the parking lot were fogged up. This meant only one thing—someone had spent the night in their vehicle. As a woman was exiting one of these cars, the concerned veterans asked her about her situation. She explained that her husband was in the ICU at the VAMC. She and her children had spent the night in their car because they had no other option. These veterans said "never again on our watch will this occur." And, thus, the idea of the guest house was born.

The Veterans Hospital Foundation received its 501(c)(3) status from the IRS in 1992. In 1994 the Reno "Spouse House" was opened and it soon become apparent that veterans needed this support as well. The original VGH was a 1935-era bungalow located at the corner of Locust and Taylor (880 Locust St.) where it housed veterans and family members for the next ten years. The original house had 3-5 beds, and prior to it being razed, provided 800-900 guest nights of lodging a year.

In 2002, the organization changed its name to Veterans Guest House, Inc (VGH) and in 2004, with the help of the community, a new 12-bed home was built. As the number of guests grew, so did the house! In 2012, a second house was built adjacent to the existing one, bringing the bed total to 17. In 2013, occupancy numbers exceeded 5,200 guest nights. The two homes were full year-round. Thanks to a much-need expansion in 2018, the facility now has 33 beds.

IN 2019, the VGH served over 6,000 guests and experienced an occupancy rate of 82 percent. The VGH partners with local casinos to provide rooms for the veterans and their families when the VGH is full.


Who stays at the Guest House?

American veterans and their families span the globe and have served in WWII, Viet Nam to Iraq and Afghanistan. These veterans and their families are the guests at the VGH. The majority of guests receive treatment at the Veterans Administration Medical Center (VAMC). The VAMC covers 100,000 square miles from Bishop to Auburn, California, Elko, and Ely Nevada. All veterans and their families are welcomed with open arms and a thank you for their service. Guests are asked to donate \$25.00 while staying at the Guest House, however, nobody is ever turned away for an inability to pay.











The American Legion's "Buddy Check" program has been a great tool for our membership, and we were proud to draft legislation that expands this program to VA. The Senate has approved legislation that would make this a national program. Now, let's make sure the House follows suit. If our Representatives don't act before Congress recesses next month, it could be at least three months before they consider this legislation again. Or it could be dropped altogether.

Join Our Action Campaign: Write Your Representative Now.

S. 544 would direct VA to establish a "Buddy Check Week," provide educational opportunities, materials, and references for veterans to learn how to conduct personal wellness checks, as well as require increased resources for the Veterans Crisis Line to handle any potential increased usage during the designated week. The bill is modeled after the American Legion's "Buddy Check National Week of Calling" to connect veterans to better ensure that they receive the care they need.

The American Legion launched "Buddy Check Week" in 2019. It has since been expanded and encourages Legionnaires to conduct veteran outreach as part of their daily routine. The idea is to reconnect with veterans who may need assistance but don't know where to go or who to ask.

We've seen <u>successful stories</u> arise out of buddy checks, before and during the pandemic. Thanks to these efforts, older veterans have received assistance in getting food and medicine, as well as having a comforting voice to talk with even for a few minutes.

Just think if that goodwill could receive the support of Congress and VA. The help veterans receive from buddy checks would skyrocket. 


